### From the Recorder



Greetings, Nobles!

Another hot and dry Summer is nearly behind us. And I am writing this piece after an exciting day of fire watch. We started out being awakened by a telephone call from a dear friend who wanted to know whether we were being evacuated. BOOM! Wide awake in seconds. Evacuated for what, as my not so wide-awake mind was

thinking already that we are too high up the mountain to be concerned by flooding... or are we...? Still not wide awake... Evacuated for FIRE!!! WOW! Now wide awake... Just like when I was on SAC Bomber Alert when we ran for the bomber at the sound of the klaxon like the place was on fire...Grab some britches and dash for the door; open it and overwhelming smell of something burning. But no visible smoke out the front door. However, out on the back deck, facing the Great Salt Lake, there was plenty of smoke to see and smell. TV news on the Gun Range Fire! Thankfully our first responders - local, state and federal (including hotshots from Idaho) did their job. There were a couple of DC-10 aerial tankers which dumped a few loads of red retardant along with several helicopters hauling water. I drove up near the site this evening and could see the red hillsides where the DC-10 tankers had unloaded. The tankers "boxed" the fire to limit its spread and the wind reversed. Out of an abundance of caution, over 200 evacuated homes will remain unoccupied until Saturday morning of Labor Day weekend. Inconvenient, but alive. WELL DONE First Responders! Incident Commander Brandon Everett, son of our own Jerry Everett, was on TV reporting to the governor about the status of the fire and its cause.

Now back to business. Please be mindful that dues notices are being distributed this month both by email and by USPS for those who do not have an email address in the Shrinenet system. So please keep an eye for "junk mail" so you do not miss your dues notice. El Kalah has 54 members who have not yet paid their 2019 dues. Of those, 28 will be up for suspension in December in accordance with El Kalah bylaws because they also owe 2018 dues. If you are one of these Nobles, please call the office so we can work with you.

### The Minotaur in the EA Degree

Greek mythology was inspired by Egyptian mysteries. Both have contributed to Masonic ritual. Let's examine the former's Myth of the Minotaur in search for Masonic roots.

In a nutshell, the Myth tells us about Princess Ariadne helping Theseus slay the

Minotaur in the labyrinth where the monster lived. She gives him a balled-up spool of twine for him to find his way back out. The escape paths out of the labyrinth coiled like the Caduceus'

double-helix. A Masonic connection does not jump out, does it? Let us dig a little bit.

I believe the Senior Steward alludes to this myth in the preparation room when he admonishes an initiate to divest himself of all "distinctions and equipment that are not in keeping with [a] humble, reverent and childlike attitude." The SS is asking him to "slay the Minotaur" for his own good and that of the Lodge he is about to join. The Minotaur has been interpreted as our ego, something we cannot overcome until we integrate the Male/Strength (Theseus) and the Female/Wisdom (Ariadne) parts of our nature. The Caduceus is a symbol of Harmony, or Healing through Integration or Balance. Its serpents symbolize Strength and Wisdom. The spool appears to represent our Cable-tow. With it we stand a chance to escape the labyrinth of illusion where the Ego is trapped. Practical interpretation: whenever we see conflict within us and our Lodges, it is because the Minotaur is winning. Have fun!
