Whence Came $\mathcal Y$ ou?



"From a lodge of the Holy Saints John at Jerusalem." What does that cryptic sentence mean to me? How significant is it that those words start the process of opening a lodge? Here is my interpretation: we come from GOD and we participate in creating the world. Masonry is deeply astronomical. The Holy Saints John represent the Tropics of Cancer and Capricorn. They frame the Milky Way, or Mill Way from where all souls were thought to come from and then return to. The Egyptians symbolized these concepts

by the Night Goddess Nut. This is why the North is "a place of darkness."

The ancients believed that souls are portions of GOD's consciousness (i.e. the Mahabbarata). They descended through Cancer and ascended Capricorn. Pythagoras learned these concepts in Egypt. Plato wrote about them extensively. They are hidden in Greek mythology, like the myth of ER. The image of a churning Mill was used by the ancients as the process of Creation. It took place by two forces,



Strength and Wisdom, represented by King Salomon (the Worshipful Master) and King Hyram (the Senior Warden.) This is why these two officers open the lodge (create) with the Square and the Compasses. Notice they are represented by two intertwined snakes.

The Junior Warden (Hiram Abiff) executes their orders. We, common men,




ultimately are responsible for the reality we create in our lives. The JW's instrument is the Plumb line. Mythology represents the (JW) as a creator: Hamlet, Thoth, Mercury, Quetzalcoatl, Gilgamesh, the Minotaur, etc. They use the Caduceus, that is two intertwined serpents around a staff (Balance, Harmony) and a Plumb

Harmony and Gilgamesh. They are made up of snakes. Gilgamesh's face depicts the snakes as a labyrinth, which is

more elaborate in the Greek myth of the Minotaur. The slaying hero Theseus finds





But the ultimate lesson of Creation is this: we must overcome our ego, our carnal nature (the Minotaur) in order to create our world using spiritual power, Strength and Wisdom. This is why the next lines in opening of the lodge reminds us we have come *"to learn to subdue our passions and improve myself in Masonry."* I hope we keep the opening of a lodge firmly in our minds as we interact with our brethren and the world at large.

Greetings and Happy St Patrick's Day to all El Kalah Nobles and Friends!

Without a 2020 sticker, you cannot participate in any El Kalah activities. Please call the Office to make arrangements to get paid up if you have not already done so. By directive in General Order #1, we are required to distribute each year to each Noble, Imperial Guidance on important, key topics such as HIPPA, Fund Raising and Elections. This month is more on FUNDRAISING. Regard **Fundraising** from G.O. #1: "Your specific attention is called to the and charitable bulaws:

following fraternal and charitable bylaws:

§335.3 Use of Name "Shriners Hospitals for Children." The use of the name "Shriners Hospitals for Children" or reference to the Hospitals in connection with any fundraising activity by a temple or Noble without the written consent of the Imperial Potentate and the chairman of the board of trustees of the Hospitals is prohibited.

§503.11 Commercial Use of Name. The use of the name "Shriners Hospitals for Children" or reference to the hospitals in connection with any commercial product or business enterprise is prohibited unless the written consent of the boards of directors and trustees has been first obtained. **"Now, therefore, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED:**

Fundraising for Fraternal Purposes: (a) No Noble (in his capacity as a Shriner), club, unit, organization of Nobles or affiliated or appendant corporations, shall engage in any fundraising activity without the express written consent of the Potentate of the temple having jurisdiction thereof. (b) There can be no representation, express or implied, that the proceeds will be for the benefit of Shriners Hospitals for Children. (c) The temple Potentate shall carefully examine all phases of the advertising, promotion and solicitation to determine that it complies with §335.3 and §503.11 of the fraternal and charitable bylaws and that there is no representation, expressed or implied, that would lead a reasonably prudent person to believe that the proceeds will be for the benefit of Shriners Hospitals for Children. If the Potentate is in doubt, he must receive the opinion of the Imperial Potentate who, after consultation with the Director of Temple Accounting, shall make the final determination. (d) The temple Potentate must approve the terms and provisions of any contract for a fundraising activity after receiving the advice of the temple attorney, and, additionally, as may be required by the temple bylaws. (e) A copy of the temple Potentate's written consent shall be mailed to the Executive Vice President, Shriners International. Further, such written material pertaining to the fundraising activity, as requested by the Executive Vice President, Shriners International, shall be promptly mailed to him."

This extract was taken from the section on Fundraising in G.O.#1 with more to follow in coming months.
