

For many of our countrymen, Memorial Day is the most solemn of Holidays, and not the legendary "Start of Summer" that many others see in the Memorial Day weekend. And the way that this start of Summer came to pass as a thought process was through the Uniform Monday Holiday Act (Pub. L. 90–363). This Act of Congress amended the federal holiday provisions of the United

States Code to establish the observance of certain holidays on Mondays. The Act was signed into **law** on June 28, 1968 and took effect on January 1, 1971. Before this act of Congress, Memorial Day was on May 30th, regardless of which day of the week was involved.

As you have undoubtedly heard many times, these are very challenging times in many different ways for each and every one of us. In the Divan, we are looking for ways to continue operations which include holding meetings and social events, conduct elections in the event the COVID-19 virus remains a roadblock and raise funding that El Kalah may continue its operations without dipping too far into reserves, among other things.
