From the Recorder



Hello, Nobles & Happy Fourth of July!

On July 1, 1776 delegates of the Continental Congress were in Philadelphia, debating over whether the 13 original colonies should declare their independence from Britain's Parliament as well as King George III, himself. That night news arrived that British ships had sailed into New York Harbor, posing an immediate threat to the Continental troops commanded by George Washington. On July 2, delegates from 12 colonies

voted in favor of independence (New York would follow suit on July 9). On July 3, even as Congress revised a draft of the Declaration of Independence composed by Thomas Jefferson, an excited John Adams took up his pen to write to his wife, Abigail, that July 2 "will be celebrated, by succeeding Generations, as the great anniversary Festival" and that the celebration should include "Pomp and Parade...Games, Sports, Guns, Bells, Bonfires and Illuminations from one End of this Continent to the other." On July 4th, the Continental Congress formally adopted the Declaration of Independence. Though the vote for actual independence took place on July 2nd, from then on, the 4th became the day that was celebrated as the birth of American independence although the Declaration of Independence was not signed until August. On July 4th, 1826, America celebrated 50 years of independence as, just a few hours apart, two of its earlier Presidents took their final breaths. At the time of his death, Thomas Jefferson was 83, while John Adams had turned 90 the year before. Though both were unwell, their deaths on July 4, 1826, came as a surprise to many—particularly as they coincided with one another on this very striking date.

Now, let us think about more current matters. On August 1, 2020 the 2021 Dues Assessment will be accomplished by Shriners International. In the spring of 2018, the Nobility of El Kalah voted to approve an annual dues increase of \$3.00 per year with the topic to be addressed again in 2025. The vote result was sent to Imperial in spring of 2018 in accordance with their bylaws. They approved and returned it too late to include the \$3 increase in to 2019 dues. Because the \$3 increase did not get included in either 2019 or 2020, you will see an increase for three years in the 2021 dues. That means a \$9 increase for most Shriners or a total of \$176.50 (By comparison, Nobles in some other Temples are paying over \$205 in 2021). In addition, El Kalah bylaws, \$5.2 Dues, states, "Members who are over 80 years old will not be required to pay temple dues, but must pay the hospital levy, Imperial per capita tax and MTA assessment." That means hospital = \$5, unless you are a permanent hospital member; Imperial per capita=\$30; unless you are a permanent Imperial per capita member; MTA per capita, 2021, \$50 or a total of \$85.
