The Potentate has put me in charge of doing the e-vote in December for elected Divan positions. He did so because of the success of the Utah Grand York Rite's election at the start of August and I was a member of the team that put that on. Along with Nobles David Hutcinson and Tim Stenner we will be using an online software called E-ballot and a Corporate account, both borrowed from Utah Grand York Rite to run elections for elected

Divan Members in December.

Requirements to attend are: 1-Current Paid Member of El Kalah 2-No Suspensions in any Masonic Body 3-Current in ALL blue lodges 4-Following ALL edicts, rules, and creeds sent by the Grand Master of Utah 2020-2021 5-Must have a working email, that is current with Grand Recorder (This will not be shared with anyone other than the Grand Recorder and those setting up the Voting list on e-ballot) 6-Access to the internet 7-Attend the Zoom Election Business meeting.

Registration for elections is: <u>https://form.jotform.com/202705065397154</u>. Registration closes December 1, 2020 and you will not be able to come to the election or the business meeting. If you do not register, you also must have your dues paid by December 1 as well. To prepare for to voting in December we will have practice elections during our Business Meetings in October, November and again December 9th. We are having registration for this online election business meeting because we have members who live so far away (Vernal, Price, St. George and even out of state). This might be a good way to do future elections, to ensure we are as inclusive of our members everywhere as we can be.

One thing learned from the Utah York Rite elections was that practice faux elections are needed so everyone understands the process and how to vote. That is why we will be doing so in October and November business meetings. Things you will need to vote: An electronic device, email and the internet. That is why we will be setting up a registration, because we need to make sure we have the online software setup so everyone's vote (which is still secret) is set up properly. We will describe the process in each of business meetings. Please know that a lot of work, blood, sweat and tears has gone into this and we love and care about each of you. The day of the election, each election will be 3 minutes or less, if you don't figure out how to vote and never came to any of the practices, we won't hold up the results for you. To participate in the practice election, you must also register! Again, election registration is: https://form.jotform.com/202705065397154 I look forward to seeing you all there.


