From the Recorder



Greetings, Nobles!

Elections are just around the corner as we head into the final month of a year which has been difficult for us all to navigate. As you know from previous articles by Divan members, the last election practice will be on December 9th, one week prior to the election night. As I read publications from various Shrine Centers around the country, a common denominator emerges which is not news to El Kalah. Every Masonic and Shrine organization has been having a tough time staving

afloat in 2020. Each State Governor and Grand Master of Masons has faced a unique and extraordinarily difficult set of challenges. The ruling documents have differing requirements, and none address the pandemic phenomena. You have probably heard this until it is coming out of your ears; but I'm gonna' say it again: be cautious; patient; safe; and sanitary. The folks with whom you are social distancing may be preoccupied because of family members who have COVID 19. Your smile (which cannot be seen because of your mask) may help make their day.

I have been reading what I can in order to stay informed about the novel COVID19 virus and I want to share some of it with you. Before I do so, I want to offer a disclaimer: I am not advocating any position, one way or the other. I just want to share some information which may help you with your decision processes (and I will not be upset if you disagree, 100% with what I think he said). I read a five-page article by Dr. Jay Bhattacharaya, MD, PhD, who is a Professor of Medicine at Stanford Medical School (I will call him Dr. B). He has many other credentials, as well. His article discussed an Anti-COVID Strategy. Dr. B states that the national COVID fatality rate is in the neighborhood of 0.2% with NYC having as high as 0.5% and Idaho having 0.13%. Studies worldwide show that "the COVID fatality rate for people 70 years and up is about 4%." Dr. B also says that COVID is less dangerous to children than the seasonal flu. He says developing and using a vaccine is essential and questions the effectiveness of complete isolation as a method to defeat COVID. Dr. B along with two other Epidemiologists met in Great Barrington, Massachusetts. Together, the three of them constructed and signed a document called the Great Barrington Declaration which has now been signed by 43,000 medical and public health scientists and medical practitioners. The document is a central part of the debate on how to best handle COVID19.

Stay Safe; wear masks; wash hands and keep your distance! We need you healthy and happy; and the medical facilities need their beds for others.
