From the Recorder



Greetings, Nobles!

This morning, January 23rd, the snowplows made a rare appearance this Winter on our Bountiful street to move a few inches of snow. The plow came prior to my trip downtown to work on clearing out the old carriage house behind the SLC Masonic Temple. There was no snow in Salt Lake City. When I returned home, I had to wait, only the second time in 15 years, for the snowplow to clear the way back up the hill. It was very slick.

One of the projects El Kalah has each year is to collect outstanding dues. To be consistent with common Masonic standards, Imperial bylaws require that dues for the current year be paid in full as of December 31st of the prior year. Nobles who have not done so are not only ineligible to attend Stated meetings, but they are also ineligible to attend Unit or Club meetings, and they cannot participate in any Shriner functions or activities. As this is written, we have 99 of 282 Nobles who owe money on their 2021 dues. In 2018, the Nobles of El Kalah voted to revise El Kalah Bylaws and implement a plan to adjust Dues slightly by \$3 each year until 2025. In that year (2025), the Nobles will review the Dues structure again and determine if more adjustment is necessary. Also adjusted in the 2018 Bylaws revision was the amount paid by those Nobles in their 80s and over. It costs El Kalah \$85 per year, every year, for every Noble- even for those who haven't paid their dues. And this year, 2021, we have on the roster 17 members who are three years behind in their Dues and are listed as Probable Suspensions – Non-Payment of Dues (NPD). That means those 17 members have each cost El Kalah \$85 per year for each of those three years, for a total of \$255 each plus mailing costs. Each Noble gets at least two written dues notices. The first notice is in August when Imperial dispatches emails to announce the assessment for the following year. The second notice is by mail from Imperial. It presents a written invoice and can be expected in early September. More notices are generated as the year goes on and the money remains unpaid. Where the money goes: 1) Hospital Assessment: ALL Shriners \$5/year, 2) Imperial Per Capita, All Shriners \$30/year, 3) Salt Lake City Masonic Temple - \$50/year for 2020 and probably 2021, although Masonic Temple per capita is year-to-year; changes, usually down, 4) El Kalah Dues - \$91.50/year, increasing by \$3/year through 2025. Total is currently \$176.50 {\$91.50 retained by El Kalah; #s 1, 2, 3 funds are throughput to other agencies). Note: \$85 for 80-year-olds and above, which begins the dues year following August 1st after the Noble's birthday, none of the \$85 money is retained by El Kalah. El Kalah is invoiced for each notice sent out by Imperial. (El Kalah dues will be assessed on August 1st, 2021 at \$94.50 for those subject to assessment). For reference, other Shrine Centers have Dues at or above \$200 per member per year.


