Greetings, Nobles and Friends!

By now, all Nobles should have gotten notices of their Dues Account balances including the 2022 dues. As with other Masonic bodies, all dues including the amount for the upcoming 2022 year are due on or before December 31, 2021.

Please keep your email addresses current and available to El Kalah. It appears there are always several pieces of correspondence which are returned after every mailing because of outdated addresses.

The election of Officers for all Shrine Clubs and Units needs to be held on or before October 31st of each year. Please, make sure that once your club or unit has elected your officers that you send the appropriate, necessary forms and information to Al Hokins or send to El Kalah Shriner's office. All Club and unit officers can be sworn in at the January 19, 2022, Stated Meeting. Thank you for your time and cooperation in this matter.

In October, I will be flying to Columbia, South Carolina for the Annual Shrine Recorders Association workshop. This year we are a little off schedule, of course, because of COVID. The usual time for these is late Winter so we can prepare for the upcoming Imperial Session. The previous workshop was held in Austin, Texas in March 2019. We finished and returned home just in time for the pandemic to take over. There was no meeting in 2020. It was a bit more difficult to handle all the changes by mail/email/ZOOM only, so we are eager to meet in person once again.

What item was banned by the U.S. government in 1943 due to a paper shortage? Americans were asked to conserve bread by observing "Wheatless Wednesdays" during World War I but during World War II the government took its rationing a step further. In January 1943, the U.S. War Foods Administration instituted a ban on what had once been advertised as "the greatest step forward in the baking industry": pre-sliced bread. The rule was intended to save on wax paper and metal. Since pre-sliced bread required more wrapping than a whole loaf to keep it from going stale, the government assumed they could easily conserve paper and curb demand for metal bread slicer parts by having people cut it themselves at home. The public response proved how wrong they were. Bakeries argued they had more than enough supplies on hand to meet demands, and housewives criticized the law in the media. "I should like to let you know how important sliced bread is to the morale and saneness of a household," began one woman's letter to the New York Times. Secretary of Agriculture Claude R. Wickard eventually bowed to the pressure and rescinded the ban after only three months, admitting, "the savings are not as much as we expected..."

Philosopher Ling



Not wishing to "supplant a brother in his laudable undertakings," I avow these lines are inspired by an article written by Brother Lucas Walsh in the September/October 2021 issue of the Scottish Rite Journal.

Brother Lucas quotes Plato's ideas about the Philosopher-King, as the most effective leader, "an authoritative man who is also moderate and wise." Plato's ideal society is ruled by "one risen to the political rulership of

his nation as a consequence of his ability to synthesize in his character both the excellent intellectual virtues of a true philosopher and the wisdom and cunning of a statesman." Plato felt such a man was "the only one worthy of governing the civic lives of his fellows. The Philosopher-King would be immune to the caprice, hedonism, avarice and hubris the infects so many appointed, hereditary or elected officials."

Indeed— "the WM represents the pillar of wisdom for he should have WISDOM to govern the lodge."


