Time seems to fly along as we re-calibrate back to pre-COVID19 levels and ways of operating.

The Shrine Recorders Association meeting was a worthwhile trip in October. There were at least 55 Recorders present including representatives from Shrine Centers in the Philippines and in Germany. The Imperial Potentate, Imperial Recorder, Imperial Marshal, Shriners International CEO, Noble John Piland and several key members of the Tampa

staff were also in attendance. All delivered presentations at various Sessions of the meeting. In a previous Minaret article, I mentioned that an increase in Imperial per capita of \$20 was defeated during the vote in July 2021. A very thorough briefing was given on this topic for the Recorders. The need for the increase is underlined by the decrease in membership since the total number of Shriners is in the vicinity of 198,000. Expect to see that increase for a vote at Imperial Session again in 2022.

As we close out our calendar year, Units and Clubs please send the Recorder updated membership rosters along with a new list of current officers.

Good news for all prospective new members! Dues for the balance of 2021 will be waived!

El Kalah currently has eleven Nobles at risk of suspension for nonpayment of dues which will be effective December 31, 2021. The names of those on the delinquency list were read at the October meeting. In accordance with Imperial Bylaws the Nobility will vote to suspended them at the November stated meeting

And now for a history lesson: In 1885 Tiffany redesigned the Great Seal of the United States, which can still be seen on the back of the one-dollar bill. Tiffany was awarded a \$1,000 contract for the work which was carried out by James Whitehouse. Whitehouse was a seal engraver, and art designer of exceptional skill. While the elements remained the same as the original, Whitehouse cleaned up the look, making the Great Seal more dynamic and heraldic. The Great Seal was not Whitehouse's or Tiffany's first work on behalf of the government. During the Civil war, Whitehouse had designed the Corps badges used by the Union Army.


