From the Chief Rabban



Greetings Nobles and friends,

Last month, February, El Kalah Shriners enjoyed the privilege of having a formal Installation Ceremony for its officers, elected, and appointed. It was both a solemn and a fun time for all present. Wives, significant others and children were recognized. It was solemn because an installation is a time for renewal when a new team of officers is put into place. It was solemn because all present heard during the ceremony, the elements of the Shriners Creed which are so vital to our

effectiveness as Shriners and as a Shrine Center. It was fun to see the Installing team composed of Past Potentates all decked out in tuxedos (and at least one in tux and red socks). It was also fun to see many of the Divan in tuxedos as well.

The purpose of the installation was defined for all in attendance. In my view, it is essential to have these concepts reviewed regularly as refreshers for all in our community. It is implied that ALL Shriners live by and support the principles of selfless, honorable service in accordance with the principles of our Order. And it was refreshing to be reminded once again of what being an officer is all about as well as being a Shriner: It is the solemn engagement, under oath, that one elected to office will serve selflessly, honorably, and in accord with the principles of this Order; so that he will thereby earn the honor and respect to which he aspires. Our Temple will prosper only to the extent that all Shriners look to its interests, instead of your own. You will earn honor only to the extent that you serve honorably, because honorable service is the measure of leadership. You will merit respect only to the extent that you observe your duties, because duty is the criteria for leadership.

Shriners believe in God and that He created man to serve His purposes, among which is service to others in His name. We believe that care for the less fortunate, especially children who suffer from burns and crippling disease, is our institutional calling. We are patriots, each willing to serve his country with fidelity and courage. We cherish independence under law and freedom with responsibility. We honor family. We respect our parents, wives, and children. We should instill in our children the tenets of this creed, and the heritage from which it emanates. As individuals we pledge ourselves to integrity, virtue, and nobility of character. Our intentions will be honorable, our relationships will be trustworthy and our spirits forgiving of each other. As brothers we offer each other fraternal affection and respect. Together we will support each other in adherence to this creed, so that we and our communities will be the better because of our fraternity and its principles. As Shriners we look beyond ourselves

to serve the needs of others, especially children who cannot help themselves. We believe Shriners Hospitals to be the world's greatest philanthropy, and we covenant with each other to support its "temples of mercy" with spirit, time, talent and means. A By now, you might have recognized that the words above, between Shriner and Shriners, are from the ritual for installations. The words including and after Shriners until the caret (^) are the complete Shriners Creed. As we became Shriners, we agreed to live by this creed which is a part of Imperial Bylaws. Now it is time for us all to revive these words; put them into our daily lives; and live by them! Doing so will make us all better Shriner Masons. And growing El Kalah will become easier as we do so!

a masonic view
