Just returned from the Shriners International Education Foundation (SIEF) Noble Academy, Membership and Marketing Conference in Texas. SIEF is a source of chapter operations education for the entire Masonic family, both men and women members from appendant, allied and affiliated bodies. Attendance at this meeting was all-inclusive Masonic and was offered to all Masonic organizations and appendant bodies from Daughters of the Nile, Prince Hall, DeMolay

International to York Rite. Conference sessions focused on recruiting but also covered Shriners Children's as well as various problem-solving techniques.

Among things noted are the following: The communities which have Masonic connections have come to expect higher character in their Masons than in the remainder of the community. It also follows that these communities have come to expect still higher character standards in their Shriners than in the remaining Masonic population.

# The Axial Age and Masonry



Our ritual may be said to be one of the tools Masonry has to help us become better men. Memorizing our ritual, as advised by the sages from the dawn of mankind, has a powerful effect on our heart and mind as we travel East. The axial age was the time period between 900-200 BCE when the likes of Buddha, Socrates, Confucius, Lao-Tzu and Jeremiah cemented ritual to change people's heart for the good. Prior to them, ritual seemed to have been mostly to appease violent Gods and to ensure the Sun came up to guarantee good crops for survival. "The prophets, mystics,

philosophers and poets of the Axial Age were so advanced, and their vision was so radical that later generations tended to dilute it. In the process, they often produced exactly the kind of religiosity the Axial reformers wanted to get rid of."  $^1$ 

As we participate in ritual, we do well to be conscious of the humane tendency to learn the letter of our ritual and miss out on the character-changing the ritual aims at. The Axial Age taught that what matters is not what we believe but how we behave. Are we more forgiving? Do we celebrate each other's differences? Are we "free of pride of knowledge" as the Sand Ceremony asks us when we become Shriners? As Spring renews our fields, these are good thoughts to ponder on our journey East.
