Greetings to the Nobility, Ladies, and Friends:

All the Nobility and their families are the future of Shriners International. We must all work together to keep our wonderful philanthropy alive. Our Fezs are our brand, and we must be ever vigilant to protect the good name of our family fraternal organization. Imperial Potentate Bill Bailey at the Oriental Guide Leadership Conference in Tampa the first

weekend of April, is very appreciative of all the good we do and wants to be sure we survive. Internationally the Shrine memberships have slipped from nearly one million members to less than 200,000 today. I think most of us in El Kalah can see the same concern with the membership in our Temple. We looked at many ways being successfully used in other Temples during the conference, but the message I heard was to tailor programs we feel will be successful in our Temple here in Utah.

Another top concern is the survival of our Temples. It was made very clear the finance for sustaining our medical philanthropy is very healthy. The finances of some Temples are not very healthy, and it is perfectly fine and encouraged by Imperial for Temples to promote fund raising for the Temples. It is imperative that fund raising for the Temple be clear that the contributions are not for Shriners Children's, pictures of the hospital may not be used on any advertisement for the event, and donations are not a deduction from taxable income. If our Temples do not survive it will be very difficult for our philanthropy to survive in perpetuity. If someone only wants to donate for the children, it goes without saying do not discourage them and it is deductible from taxable income.

I want to thank all the Nobility, Ladies, and friends, who provide their time, talent, and treasure to El Kalah. Without your commitment and dedication our Shrine organization would be far less effective. We need to share ideas on how to attract more members, provide activities, create new clubs and/or units that will be of interest to younger adults. My suggestions would include a group to share, discuss, and develop skills in use of social media. The promoting of a game night program where members would bring their families and favorite games and share them with other Shrine families and invite prospective members and their families. One Temple invested in extra-large game sets like chess, battleship, checkers, etc., that they found popular. An activity we can also promote is the First Lady Debby Bailey's detection of possible scoliosis. You can download a free App, SpineScreen, and it will instruct you on how to use the App to determine if an individual possibly has scoliosis.

This month I want to remind every Noble to check your personal records in WebFez. Each Noble can get in check or update his information. Use WebFez to verify your personal information, payments, and Shrine activity. **How to Register for WebFez:** Go to your browser's address bar and type in *webfez.shrinenet.org*; Click the button on the Login page.; From the Registration page, choose your Temple from the drop-down list and then type in your Shrine ID (found on your membership card) and your First and Last names; Click on the

Register button. You will be directed to the Create a New Account page. On this page enter an E-mail address that you will use to log in with, confirm the E-mail address, and then enter and confirm your Password; Scroll down to read the WebFez User Agreement and Privacy policy. Agree by clicking the checkbox; After the checkbox is selected, click on Register. This will Register you for WebFez and log you into the system. **How to Log in to WebFez:** Important: To log in to WebFez, you must first be registered. If you have not yet registered, please see above. You only need to register once. To log in to WebFez please follow the steps below: Go to your browser's address bar and type in webfez.shrinenet.org; Enter your login E-mail address and Password in the designated fields; Click Log in.

Shriners Children's is celebrating their 100th Anniversary this year. It all started in June 1922. Since that time, many millions of dollars have been spent to pay for the great care Shriners is so famous for. Donations and Fund raising have been responsible for the vast majority of it. For most of those 100 years donations alone were all that was needed. In more recent years, medical costs have increased enormously, and

have outstripped our ability to survive on donations alone. Shriners Children's has had to change its approach, a bit by accepting insurance for services rendered and we have relied more and more on our endowment to make it all happen. However, the need for fundraising has never been more important.

Since we have moved to an outpatient services and rehab center at our location, some have that thought fund raising was no longer necessary. **That thinking could not be more incorrect.** Even though surgeries are now done at Primary Children's, we are still financially responsible for our patients under our current guidelines.

I had an interesting experience this month and worth mentioning, I think. On the island of Kauai, Robyn and I took an ATV excursion through the mountain jungle at the heart of the island. It was a great time. My point is this small company providing the tours, Kipu Ranch Adventures, noticed Robyn was wearing the Shriners International PGA golf cap and suddenly the whole place became very excited. Turns out, that little company, in the middle of nowhere, recently held a fundraiser for, you guessed it, Shriners Hospitals for Children. 
