This month of July is full of many different parades, and it is kicked off with the Freedom Festival in Provo on the 4th. We need ALL-hands-on-deck, and we need all members, clubs, and units to participate in this parade. The following are instructions about the night before and day of the parade from the Parade Director: "On behalf of America's Freedom Festival Parade Committee, I want to thank you for your participation in this year's Fourth of July Parade. Please plan on bringing your float to the staging area behind Zions Bank at 1060 N. University Avenue, Provo between 5 pm and 10 pm on Sunday July 3rd. A parade representative will be there during these hours to get your float situated in its proper staging location for the parade. Security will be watching the floats all night. Please have all your people who will be in the parade at this staging area by 6:30 AM on July 4th as roads will close at that time and traffic gets quite congested beyond this time. Parking is available at the BYU lot 18 just East of Baskin Robbins on Bulldog Blvd. (NOT in the Baskin Robbins parking lot.) Parking also is available at BYU lot 58, the Information Technology Building (1356 N.

University Ave.) Please try to carpool or have people dropped off as parking is more limited this year because BYU is accommodating FSY counselor parking in many of the lots we once used. Let the security guard at these lots know that you are with a parade entry, and you can park there. Each entry needs to add some element of patriotism to it. This is a very well attended parade, over 300,000 spectators, and is televised. You can de-stage/park to pick up members of your entry at the end of the route at the Multi Stake center parking lot 350 N. 900 E. Please do not park your floats or entries on the closed road to watch the end of the parade." We look forward to the mini bikers, clunkers, mounted patrol, fire brigade, clowns, LOS, and all members of El Kalah who can come bring your families and participate. We are hopeful, that the fire truck, bus, and float will all be fixed and available to be part of our entry. I look forward to seeing you all in Provo on the 4th, throughout the state at our other Parades, and using the Shriners Pavilion in Hobble Creek Canyon.

Nobles, I have a favor to ask, if you get an email from **El Kalah Shriners - WebFez** please open and read it. We email information to the Nobles through WebFez, and it could be important or at least hopefully interesting. This month is another instalment in the mandatory communications. Please read it over and if you do a fund raiser make sure everything is correctly, please ask questions.

FUNDRAISING ACTIVITIES (continued) 2. Fundraising for Charitable Purposes: (a) No Noble (in his capacity as a Shriner), club, unit, organization of Nobles or affiliated or appendant corporations shall engage in any charitable fundraising activity other than for Shriners Hospitals for Children. A request to fundraise for Shriners Hospitals for Children is now initiated through

a module in WebFez. The temple recorder and/or designated staff are required to take online training to gain access to the module. See updated Charitable Fundraising – Approval and Reporting on page 46 of this publication. Permission therefor must be first obtained in writing from the temple Potentate. The temple Potentate must then obtain written permission from the chairmen of the boards of directors and trustees. This request for written permission shall be sent to the Executive Vice President, Shriners International, P. O. Box 31356, Tampa, FL 33631-3356. No charitable fundraising activity shall be held in the jurisdiction of another temple without the written permission of the Potentate of that temple. (i) A joint charitable fundraising activity with another 501(c)(3) charity may be authorized, provided that a minimum of 50% of the net proceeds are for the benefit of Shriners Hospitals for Children, and the chairmen of the boards of directors and trustees determine, on a case-by-case basis, that it is in the best interest of Shriners Hospitals for Children and they grant their written permission for the activity. (ii) A charitable fundraising activity conducted by a temple located outside of the U.S.A. may be authorized for other charities, provided that the chairmen of the boards of directors and trustees determine, on a case-by-case basis, that it is in the best interest of Shriners Hospitals for Children, and they grant their written permission for the activity. (b) All Shrine temples and their units, Shrine clubs, Shrine Associations, and their units and Imperial Sessions of Shriners International are prohibited from engaging telemarketing firms and direct mail firms to assist with fundraising for Shriners Hospitals for Children. No new contracts are permitted without first obtaining written permission from the chairmen of the boards of directors and trustees. (c) 100% of net proceeds (as defined in the Charitable Fundraising—Approval and Reporting provisions of this General Order) from charitable fundraising must be given to Shriners Hospitals for Children except for such portion thereof as may be permitted to be retained for the temple Shrine Hospital Patient Transportation Fund, pursuant to the Special Purpose Funds provisions of any General Order. Provided, however, if the chairmen of the boards of directors and trustees determine for good cause shown, that the law of the land requires that a portion of the net proceeds must be distributed locally, then they may, if they determine it to be in the best interest of Shriners Hospitals for Children, grant their written permission for such distribution. The remaining net proceeds from charitable fundraising must be given to Shriners Hospitals for Children and may not be designated or restricted in any way other than for research at one or all our hospitals. (d) The temple shall report the result of each charitable fundraising activity within sixty days of the activity, pursuant to the Charitable Fundraising—Approval and Reporting provisions of any General Order.

Add To Your Toolkit



We are given tools in each Blue Lodge degree to travel East in search of The Lost Word. Here are two more tools to consider: concentration and retrospection. Eastern societies readily accept the concept of subjugation of the ego through meditation. Western societies not so much. In fact, the ego and its accomplishments are exalted as means to achieve material gain. Yet, western seekers/travelers seem to understand a modified approach—concentration of the mind. Consider the

following exercise: instead of an Eastern lotus, picture a rose hanging in midair about three feet from you. If you can hold that image without interruption for eighteen seconds, consider yourself successful. You may picture the rose blooming, or its petals falling. Do this in the morning while still in bed. Do not repeat the exercise until the next morning. With time, you will gain a modicum of control over your mind, which will lead to "subduing your passions." Retrospection is best done as you return to bed.
