I hope everybody had a fun and safe Halloween! It's time to back away from the bags of Halloween candy...

By now, everyone should be aware that we are beginning to feel the result of no boiler in the Salt Lake Masonic Temple (SLMT). No heat in the building is not only uncomfortable and inconvenient for human occupants, but it is a distinct hazard for the health of the building, itself. The

inside must be kept at a temperature above freezing to protect the water lines throughout the nearly 100-year-old edifice. October weather was kind this year, and, therefore, meetings in the SLMT were largely without negative impact from having no boiler as the weather began to cool down. El Kalah's October, midmonth meeting hardly noticed the boiler absence. We will closely monitor conditions inside the building as they evolve in November. Please bear with us and be prepared to respond to any potential changes in location which could result from a cold weather impact on the SLMT. Thank you in advance for your patience with this unexpected turn in events.

The basic problem is with manufacturing of the new boiler. We are told there are not enough skilled technicians to build the new boilers being ordered. We are still awaiting the new boiler to be delivered for installation as soon as it arrives. Current projected arrival and installation remain December 2022. Please be prepared for cooler than usual SLMT in the meantime.

Parking challenges around the Temple continue but the contractors have removed some office space and surrendered some parking lot space. Work continues with completion planned for early 2023.

There was a very successful Grand Master's Class at the Bountiful Temple in October. Twenty-four new Master Masons from around the state left the building that day. Keep your eye out for new Shriners from that group! Please keep in mind the recruiting needs of our fraternity as we enjoy Autumn activities. Share your experiences with friends and neighbors. Many want the things which we offer and have. They just do not know how to proceed, and we can help them become Masons and Shriners.

Please be safe as Winter approaches! We need each of you to be active Shriners.
