Greetings All!

Over the next several months I will be highlighting portions of the 2022 annual letter to the staff of Shriners Children's, Salt Lake City from Dr. Carroll, Chief of Staff. As you will see 2022 was a year of challenge, change and success. I hope you keep the staff, their patients and

families in your thoughts and prayers throughout this year.

With the help of our departmental leaders, here is a synopsis of our accomplishments in 2022 as an outpatient facility:

From Alyssa about our international kids:

Alyssa has moved on to working for Headquarters as a soldier of our international mission- I am glad that she is there to fight for our children in other countries and their access to our care. In addition, she still helps with our Juarez Telehealth and the coordination of operative care with the Portland Shriner's Children's Hospital.

"We provided over 90 telehealth/FTVV visits for our Mexico patients in 2022. The Juarez telehealth clinic will continue for the near future, though we are working on details to hold an in-person new patient screening clinic in El Paso during the first quarter of 2023. We have continued to collaborate with our sister facility in Portland to provide surgical services for these patients, with 20 surgeries performed this year. We were also able to start welcoming back our international AOT** patients, with many more slated to come for services in 2023.

Our staff is really looking forward to an in-person clinic held with Portland in El Paso."

We are still in the market for a patient navigator to help with scheduling AOT appointments and travel. If you know someone interested in helping with this mission who has amazing Spanish language skills, please let us know!

**Adenomatoid odontogenic tumor (AOT) is a benign (hamartomatous) lesion of odontogenic origin and an uncommon tumor which affects young individuals with a female predominance, mainly in the second decade. This lesion is most commonly located in the anterior maxilla and is usually associated with an impacted canine tooth.
