Over the next several months I will be highlighting portions of the 2022 annual letter to the staff of Shriners Children's, Salt Lake City from Dr. Carroll, Chief of Staff. As you will see 2022 was a year of challenge, change and success. I hope you keep the staff, their patients and

families in your thoughts and prayers throughout this year.

From Nathan Clark in Development:

The year of 2022 began full of aspiration and hope. After SLC's largest fundraising year in history in 2021, we set off on our largest goal ever-\$4 million in 2022. As all journeys do, we experienced some unexpected detours. Our Donor Development Department went through change in early spring. We said farewell to two of our long-time employees, Nancy Wiscomb and Kim Milligan, and welcomed two more: Mary Stuart, a new Associate Development Director and Makensie Dawson, Development Officer.

As good works abound at Shriners, so do those miraculous moments. We were thrilled to have a very productive first quarter reaching \$1.3M in donations. Our Board of Governors and Administration's support through all the steps of hiring was remarkable. The summer months brought forth Proud Supporter events in grand style, something we had not experienced since pre COVID days. By autumn, we were fully staffed, and kicked off a new venue and site for our Walk for Love – Utah's Hogle Zoo! It was a magical night of animal growls and patient cheers! We celebrated Shriners Children's 100th anniversary, our outgoing Administrator, Kevin Martin, and acknowledged all the patients and families in attendance. We had 101 patients register to walk with a more than 700 people in attendance. Patients in teal-colored shirts walked the park greeted by Shriners, physicians and staff. It was a momentous occasion, the first time we had been back together, in person, for a Walk for Love since 2019. The magical night

was heard all throughout – complete with children's laughter and a lion roaring. Our Walk for Love brought in net proceeds of \$108,000. Sponsorship support was almost doubled from previous years, and Big O Tires, graciously pledged to do be our Presenting Sponsor again next year.

Behind all these magical moments is a hard-working Development team, collaboratively working together with others to make an impact on every child who enters our doors. As we come to a close in the year, we have raised a total of \$3.7M from 14,293 gifts from 3,503 donors. With one more month to go to reach our goal, we are set to exceed \$4M!

This could not have been done without the commitment of a small team of fundraisers, some new, some old, a supportive Board of Governors, Administration, MarCom and other departments helping us through our transition, all working together to make a difference ... one child at a time.



EL KALAH SHRINERS PINEWOOD DERBY SEPTEMBER 20, 2023

RULES FOR BUILDING YOUR PINEWOOD DERBY CAR

Each local Pinewood Derby committee determines the rules for building and racing cars. The committee will need to make sure their rules don't conflict with those of the district or council to ensure their members can participate in events at those levels.

BSA's Pinewood Derby Car Building Rules

Each local Pinewood Derby committee determines the rules for building and racing cars. The committee will need to make sure their rules don't conflict with those of the district or council to ensure their members can participate in events at those levels.

According to the BSA's Cub Scout Leader How-To-Book, the general rules are as follows:

All cars must pass the following inspection to qualify for the race:

- 1. Width shall not exceed 2-3/4 inches.
- 2. Length shall not exceed 7 inches.
- Weight shall not exceed 5 ounces.
- Axles, wheels, and body shall be from the materials provided in the kit. Additional wheels can be purchased separately.
- 5. Wheel bearings, washers, and bushings are prohibited.
- No lubricating oil may be used. Axles may be lubricated with powdered graphite or silicone.

- 7. The car shall not ride on any kind of spring.
- 8. The car must be free-wheeling, with no starting devices.
- 9. No loose materials of any kind are allowed in the car.
