November is a very special month with two Federal Holidays. Please take a moment to remember our veterans and the origin of Veterans Day – formerly Armistice Day to commemorate the end of WWI which was to have been the war-to-end-all-wars. The Armistice ending that horrible event was signed in a railroad car in France at the eleventh hour of the eleventh day of the eleventh month of 1918. One year later, in 1919, the holiday had its origin.

The first USA celebration using the term Veterans Day occurred in Birmingham, Alabama, in 1947. Other countries celebrate it, too. Veterans Day honors all of those who have served the country in war or peace — dead or alive — although it is largely intended to thank living veterans for their sacrifices. A law passed in 1968 changed the national commemoration of Veterans Day to the fourth Monday in October. It soon became apparent, however, that November 11 was a date of historic significance to many Americans. Therefore, in 1978 Congress returned the observance to its traditional date. Of course, the favorite of many is Thanksgiving which is also this month. Food, Family, Football & Fun! Not to forget, El Kalah Shriners gather to watch some ice hockey the day following Thanksgiving. Noble Blake is again tending to those details. Hope to see you there.

Membership remains THE critical area for El Kalah! Everybody should be working on bringing in new Shriners!

We'll never know exactly what each Veteran experiences and how they are touched by war. But we can welcome our Veterans home, support them and their families, and thank them for their service whenever possible." *Lori Thompson,* Executive Director 2021 - Present Two of our El Kalah veterans were each awarded a Quilt of Valor in a special ceremony in October, 2023. The formal presentation was arranged by the Utah Grand Chapter of the Order of Eastern Star. It took the OES about a year from the time that they decided to nominate these men until the formal presentation was made at a dinner during the annual Grand Chapter meeting. Chaplain and National President of the National Sojourners, Chuck Warren was a foreign language specialist and intercept operator. Potentate Al Hokins flew 53 combat missions taking hostile surface-to-air missile fire in Southeast Asia in a B52d bomber, delivering over 2,100 tons of ordnance during the Vietnam War. Dinner attendees enjoyed seeing a total surprise which honored the military contributions of these two Shriners.

During this month when we honor our Nations' veterans, we take special pride in the military contributions of ALL our El Kalah veterans!
