

Dear Fellow Nobles, Ladies, and Friends:

I trust all of you have had a joyous Holiday season, and for those of you celebrating Christmas, that Santa found you on his nice list, and not the naughty list. I must have been on the nice list, because my Christmas was very

joyous and warm. I received a big bucket of coal, and it kept my home nice and toasty.

I cruised the internet to see if there were any Shriners on the naughty list in current and previous years, and was surprised to find PETA was not happy with some Shrine 'chapters'. Now I was a bit confused because I thought PETA was an acronym for 'people eating tasty animals,' and thought of myself as one of them. What a surprise when I read, they are 'people for the ethical treatment of animals,' and I certainly do not oppose the ethical treatment of animals, but they are very unhappy with the treatment of the animals in circuses, and specifically mention Shrine circuses. A Jay Pratte, a claimed expert on animal behavior, wrote a book claiming in his visits to Shrine circuses that, 'environmental and physiological neglect, psychological abuse,

and coercion of animals to behave through dominance and fear-based techniques,' standard procedures. Animals in Shrine circuses are leased from outside exhibitors.

There are also claims of misogyny. Shriners do not allow women to join them, including transgender women. Women who want to participate are relegated to 'ladies' organizations and typically require being related to Shriner, or a Mason by birth, marriage, or adoption. Racism is also an epithet hurled our way, since Shrine 'chapters' have names rooted in racist tropes, such as Arabia, Mohammed, Mecca, and Oriental. All this negativity in this internet article appears the author is not clear on our fraternity and its' origins or history, and the leap to racism boggles my mind. An excerpt from Dr. Carroll's 2023 Christmas letter to the staff:

Happy Holidays Everyone! As this is probably the last end of year summary I will write, I decided to do something a little different this year. I'm writing a letter of gratitude to all of you, department by department. I've worked at Shriners Salt Lake City for twenty-seven years; I have lots of memories of the wonderful people, and the wonderful things they have accomplished, over this time. I know I will leave some things out - if I trigger a memory for you, then please send it on to me. We can collect them and place them in the Remarkable, month by month in 2024. Before I start, let me just touch on the folks we lost during the transition. There is not an operative day that goes by at PCH [Primary Children's Hospital] when I don't miss our incredible OR nurses,

Ancient philosophers like Timon of Phlius, Arcesilaus, Pyrrho, Eratosthenes, and **Sextus Empiricus** hoped to attain quietude, just like us moderns. They were perturbed by the contradictions in things; they doubted which of alternative "facts" they ought to accept. The dilemma led them to inquire what is true in things and

what is false, hoping by the settlement of this question to attain peace of mind.

"The main basic principle of the skeptic system is that of opposing to every proposition an equal proposition; for we believe that as a consequence of this we end by ceasing to dogmatize. Accepting dogmas as truths, skepticism claimed, locked one into an established mindset which one then felt compelled to defend instead of question. By remaining skeptical of all dogma, one was free to explore the

subject matter on one's own through reason. By pursuing this course, one might still not come to know what one did not know, but would at least know that what one knew could be considered accurate."[1] In this age of "false news," "alternative facts," and hyper-partisanship, we would do well to fall back on our ancient pillars of Strength, Wisdom, and Balance between them. It would be a BEAUTYful thing to do as we travel East, respectful of others' dogmas. All of them possess a portion of truth we cannot afford to dismiss without civil consideration.
