# Equilibrium and Intellectual Development



Piaget was a Swiss Psychologist best know for studying the stages of child development. And, sure enough, in accordance with the teachings of our MM Lecture, he could not help but discover that people develop in accordance to the same principles of "Wisdom, Strength and Beauty, which each succeeding age has framed agreeably to its own

peculiar cast of thought and which the human imagination mya awaken to countless forms of gracious life."

To quote from his seminal work: "Intelligence is the form of Equilibrium—Balance, a Harmonious adjustment [Beauty-Harmony] towards which the successive adaptations and exchanges between the organism and his environment are directed... There is no single and final intelligence, but rather a succession of intellectual stages... a system of living. Equilibrium results from regulations that tend toward better forms of knowledge; Piaget describes three forms of Equilibrium: Between a person and an object. Between various cognitive systems. This implies that ALL systems have value. We do best by finding a Balance between them. And Between an overall cognitive system and its component subsystems, that is, between the whole and its parts. Piaget even reminds us that we never stop travelling East in quest of the True Word, or further light and knowledge.
